

# 2021 Grant Recipients

**The Bascom \$15,000** to help fund need-based scholarships and to help cover costs of the after-school enrichment “S.T.E.A.M.” (science, technology, engineering, arts, math) project kits for local school children.

**Big Brothers, Big Sisters \$7,500** to support their aggressive Big Little match and programing growth goals, providing one-on-one tutoring support for at-risk children on the Highlands-Cashiers plateau.

**Blue Ridge Free Dental Clinic \$15,000** to provide partial or full dentures for individuals with no means for paid dental care. With 11 volunteer dentists, the Clinic performed 1,211 emergency procedures in 2020, in addition to 459 restorative procedures, plus cleanings & exams.

**Boys and Girls of the Plateau \$12,000** to help provide salary support for a new staff coordinator for their teen program.

**Cashiers Highlands Humane Society \$10,000** to help defray cost for the local dog and cat spay and neuter program.

**Cashiers Historical Society \$10,000** to provide funding for needed electrical upgrades on the outside and interior of the historical property.

**Community Care Clinic Highlands-Cashiers \$20,000** to help five volunteer physicians provide medical services for the poor in the community, focusing on diabetes and “behavioral health,” as well as OB/GYN Board-certified care. Patients are individuals with family incomes well below Federal poverty levels. In a normal year, nearly 500 people are served.

**Counseling & Psychotherapy Center of Highlands \$15,000** to help subsidize therapists’ fees for individuals in need, able to pay on a sliding scale based on means. With no government subsidies and meager coverage for mental care, the Center brings much-needed services to local children, families and individuals on the Plateau.

**Fishes & Loaves Food Pantry \$7,500** to help supply food for 2,530 local households (over 7,750 people) living below the poverty level in the Macon/Jackson county area. During Covid, the Pantry experienced a 20 percent increase in need and has adapted its distribution dramatically. It is manned entirely by 12 local churches and volunteers.

**Friends of Albert Carlton Library \$7,500** to assist in covering the operating costs for this well-used Cashiers community center, which provides e-resources, as well as community internet access.

**Friends of Panthertown, Inc. \$7,500** to help fund a part-time stewardship assistant to help lead volunteers maintain hiking, cycling and equestrian trails in this 6,295-acre forestry treasure open to the public year-round.

**Highlands Biological Foundation \$5,000** to fund summer camp scholarships for local children in 2022, who otherwise could not afford to participate. The summer programs teach children to appreciate, live within, and to protect the eco-system of the Highlands Plateau.

**Highlands-Cashiers Chamber Music \$10,000** to fund the 2022 Residency program—in which a Julliard quartet provides concerts and interaction with children in each of our local schools (Blue Ridge, Summit and Highlands), as well as performances at Chestnut Hill Retirement Home and free-to-the-public concerts at two local churches.

**Highlands-Cashiers Land Trust \$10,000** funding to support the continuation of the *Kids & Nature Program* in 2022, which builds children’s appreciation of our natural surroundings and the importance of conservation, reaching students from the local schools, the Gordon Center and Sunshine Centers, the Literacy Council and the Boys & Girls Club of the Plateau.

**Highlands-Cashiers Players \$6,900** to fund three upcoming local community theater productions.

**Highlands Community Child Development Center \$8,500** to purchase a new commercial freezer for the Center that provides high quality, safe and essential childcare for 74 local infants and toddlers.

**Highlands Emergency Council \$15,000** to provide heating assistance, by directly paying propane, oil, kerosene and wood bills for local people and families-in-need throughout the winter.

**Highlands Historical Society \$5,000** to provide museum-quality lighting for upgraded exhibits presented in collaboration with Western North Carolina University’s Museum Studies Program.

**Highlands Playhouse \$10,830** to purchase a new lighting console.

**Hudson Library \$10,000** to reconstruct the ceiling and lighting in the entrance, vestibule and lobby area of this popular community center.

**International Friendship Center (IFC) Food Pantry \$18,000** to provide groceries to supplement local workers/families facing hardship, as well funding for their Latino women’s initiative and services to assist the working poor navigate life and immigration documentation issues. Nearly 11,000 individuals are helped by this facility.

**Junior Appalachian Musicians of Blue Ridge \$6,000** To help fund this afterschool program giving children, particularly from the Blue Ridge and Summit Charter Schools, the opportunity to experience a sense of community through the joy of participating in traditional mountain music, teaching them to play the fiddle, banjo, mandolin or guitar in concert.

**Literacy Council of Highlands, Inc. \$20,000** to help fund general operating support for after-school enrichment, individual tutoring, GED preparation, English-as-a-Second Language classes and the Dolly Parton Imagination Library, serving 3,000 students of all ages free of charge.

**Performing Arts Center Youth Theater Program \$5,000** to help fund this excellent program for local middle and high school students interested in the Arts, many times as an alternative to athletics, exposing them to all aspects of theatrical production from scripting to costuming, performance, building sets, staging, lighting and sound.

**Peggy Crosby Center \$6,500** to purchase an HVAC Halo purification system for the center which houses non-profits and start-up organizations.

**Pisgah Legal Services \$7,500** to further the works of their newly established Highlands office, which provides access to pro bono legal services for low-income people living and working on the Plateau.

**Summit Charter School \$15,000** to help fund their *Step Up to Kindergarten* and *Moby Max ELA* programs for disadvantaged children, and to purchase music supplies for their new and expanding music program.

**Vision Cashiers-Ramble Story Walk Project \$4,000** to fund a changeable outdoor story-walk, a part of the revitalization of the Cashiers Greenway Ramble surrounding the Village Green, which engages young and old alike in a fun activity walk advancing both English and Spanish literacy.
